

**Central Ohio Care Coordination Project

(updated: August 3, 2009)**



Purpose/Scope: Provide input on strategies and initiatives for improving sustainable patient-centered care coordination across emergency departmentsⁱ and with community health centersⁱⁱ for all people in central Ohio – starting with hospitals located in Franklin County.

Composition: Leaders representing hospitals, health care practitioners, community health centers, public health, and patient advocates.

Responsibilities: Provide input on:

1. Strategies and initiatives for improving patient-centered care coordination between emergency departments and with community health centers
2. Design of initiatives as selected by Collaborative
3. Feasibility plans for sustaining care coordination initiatives
4. Initiative evaluations
5. Reports to the community

ⁱⁱ *Community Health Center is usually associated with Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC). However, Community Health Centers include hospital affiliated and other non-profit primary care practices in a community that offer a sliding fee and provide continuity of care.*
